

The Nine Series - Fruit of the Holy Spirit Self-Control

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control." (Galatians 5:22-23)

Self-Control (Greek egkrateia) - the power or lordship one has over his or herself; the ability to restrain and control your emotions, impulses, and desires

- Christian self-control is more <u>Spirit</u>-control than <u>self</u>-control. It's letting Jesus being Lord
 and submitting your impulses and desires to his input and leadership. It's harnessing
 your effort to <u>keep in step</u> with the Spirit.
- What motivates our self-control is our desire to be *faithful* to God.
- As you walk the path of self-control with Jesus, keep your eyes peeled for God-sent escape hatches.
- If you are struggling with self-control, find the <u>God-intended</u> outlet for that <u>God-given</u> desire.
- Christian self-control is kingdom-minded and profoundly intentional.
