

ALL IN - The Fall of the House of Elimelech Pastor Ryan White - September 1, 2019 Key Passage: Ruth 1:1-5

"In those days there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in his own eyes." (Judges 21:25)

Is Elimelech in any way responsible for the disaster that befalls his family?

- Elimelech had a <u>crisis of trust</u>, specifically in the character of God.
 - hesed (חֶ ֹסֶד) God's extraordinary loyalty and gracious devotion to those whom he calls his own
- Elimelech chose to <u>seize control</u> of the leadership of his own life.
 - Questions Elimelech should have asked:
 - What does the Bible say on this matter?
 - How does this decision conform with the moral will of God?
- Heedless of God and his will, Elimelech stepped out from under <u>God's protection</u>, his wing of refuge.

In contrast to Elimelech, God invites us to trust him and depend upon his *hesed*.

- If you seek to trust God more, <u>fortify your mind</u> as to the nature of his character.
 - "What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us." (A.W. Tozer)
 - Lamentations 3:21-23
- Then with hope and patient endurance, seek to live your life <u>within the bounds</u> of the land of promise.
