



**“My Eyes Have Seen The King!”**  
**Pastor Ryan White - November 24, 2019**  
**Key Passage: Isaiah 6**

“In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple.” (Isaiah 6:1)

Isaiah experiences the failure of a dream as he and his people come to the end of their strength.

- “Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips!” (v. 5)

In his acknowledgement of weakness, Isaiah catches a glimpse of the coming king. He discovers that the death of our effectiveness means the birth of God’s glory.

- “For my eyes have seen the King!” (v. 5)
- “The holy seed is its stump.” (v. 13)
- “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty! The whole earth is full of his glory!” (v. 3)

Isaiah experiences the gospel in miniature as something holy is drawn from the very presence of God and comes to impart its purity, wholeness, and life to us.

- “Having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar, he touched my mouth and said: 'Look, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for.'” (vv. 6-7)
